Rocket harriers outrun Bluejays

MENASHA — The Neenah High School boys' and girls' cross country teams both tallied the minimum point totals in outscoring Menasha in their dual on the Jefferson Park course on a beautiful Tuesday afternoon.

Both Neenah teams sent the first five runners into the chute for 15 points. The Bluejays recorded 48 in both races.

Leading the unbeaten Rocket girls' squad again was senior Kathy Schaller, who won her fifth straight race.

Her winning time of 11:27 was 11 seconds better than teammate Collette Goudreau.

Eileen Schaller finished third in 11:46, getting to the finish line one second ahead of Joan Swanson. Kathy Monard placed fifth in 11:52.

Menasha's Becky Boegh, challenging to break into the top five the entire race, placed sixth in 11:56. Neenah's Burr twins, Kris and Sue, were seventh and eighth in 12:00 and 12:06, respectively.

Other Bluejay finishers were Sara Morawek 12:29, Jill Jackson 12:39, Terese Mulder 13:08 and Jodi VanderWielen 13:33.

Not only was the victory the fifth of the season for the talented Rocket girls, but it was their 16th over the last two, including the state meet.

Ted Owen led the Neenah boys in picking up their initial victory by winning in 16:11.

Bill Jarosh was second in 16:17, Eric Oakley third in 16:17 plus, John Boudry fourth in 16:30, Tom Schaper fifth in 16:32 and Erik Scribner sixth in 16:39.

Menasha's Craig Noffke placed seventh in 16:53, edging teammate Ted Thompson, who arrived at the finish line at the same time.

Neenah's Jim Lamb was ninth and Menasha's Mike Madsen 10th, John Strand 11th, John Rohr 12th and Pete Schwonek 13th.

Neenah also won the jayvee boys' race 15-44.

Alex Collins was first in 13:38, followed by Andy Christian, Chris Fiedler, Scott Meulemans and Jeff Enz.

Menasha's Bob Marhefke placed sixth, Mike Kinde seventh, Tim Giebink ninth and Eric Meyer 10th. Neenah's Jeff Wheeler was eighth.

Neenah girls' Coach Ron Fedenko said his team ran well on a beautiful day, adding that the times weren't bad.

Boys' Coach Tom Jensen said he was pleased to see his squad finish in a group.

"There was only 34 seconds between the first and seventh place finishers and 21 seconds from one to five," Jensen pointed out. "If we're going to do well in the conference, we'll have to run in a group," he added.

"Our times were good. Becky (Boegh) ran in the 11 minutes and Morawek finished in 12:30," Menasha Coach Terry Langan pointed out. He added that Jackson also posted her best time.

Of the Bluejay boys, Langan said some ran well and others didn't.

The Menasha teams will compete in the Manitowoc Invitational Saturday while the Rockets will be idle until next Tuesday when they join the Bluejays, Appleton West and Appleton East for a meet at East.
