NHS girls race to 21st victory; boys take 2nd

NEENAH — The Neenah girls' and boys' cross country teams successfully concluded their series of fall invitationals with a first and second place, respectively, at Fort Atkinson Saturday morning.

For the girls, it was their 20th consecutive invitational triumph, dating back to 1979, their ninth straight victory this season and their 21st in a row in the last two campaigns.

They totaled 24 points, their highest score of the season, but still beat Monroe by 40.

Verona totaled 131, Middleton 134, Portage 157, Whitewater 214, Mount Horeb 221, Beaver Dam 224, Platteville 235, Watertown 248, Fond du Lac 292, Arrowhead 360, Stoughton 379,

Fort Atkinson 397, DeForest 400 and Mukwanago 468.

Monroe took the boys' race with 42 points. The Rockets tallied 82 and Milwaukee Thomas More, winner over Neenah in two previous meets, was third with 108.

Other totals were Waukesha South 109, Waukesha North 150, Middleton 154, New Berlin Eisenhower 180, Mukwonago 227, Stoughton 233, Fond du Lac 236, Arrowhead 306, Beaver Dam 311 and Watertown 356.

Kathy Schaller was the girls' winner in 11:47. It was her ninth straight triumph without a loss.

Sue Keeney of Middleton took second with 12:13, followed by Neenah's Eileen Schaller third in 12:17, Kathy

Monard fourth in 12:19, Kris Burr fifth in 12:26, Sue Burr 11th in 12:35, Joan Swanson 15th in 12:44, Colette Goudreau 25th in 13:07 and Amy Rusch 29th in 14:26.

Keeney, according to Coach Ron Fedenko, raced to a big lead but the Rockets ran a smart race and didn't try to run with her at the start.

"Colette Goudreau has a leg injury. We probably will hold her out of the conference meet Thursday," Fedenko said.

He said it was a nice victory for the Rockets because they ran in a big field and were running against the Nos. 1, 3 and 4 ranked teams (Mount Horeb, Verona and Portage) in Class B and Monroe, the No. 4 team, in Class A.

Eric Oakley led the Neenah boys with a sixth place finish in 16:57.

Ted Owen was 12th in 17:13, Bill Jarosh 13th in 17:14, John Boudry 25th in 17:34, Tom Schaper 26th in 17:36, Erik Scribner 37th in 17:58, Kevin Shattuck 44th in 18:10 and Tom Lamb 62nd in 18:34.

Richard Simmons of Thomas More was the winner in 16:08.

"It was our best meet of the year. Thomas More was ranked eighth and Waukesha South 11th last week. The boys are gaining confidence. I think we're capable of competing with the top 10," Coach Tom Jensen declared.

Neenah won the nine-school junior varsity race with 46 points. Monroe was second with 84.

Alex Collins finished sixth, Pat Shandonay eighth, Jim Lamb ninth, Rob Wilson 10th, John Kidd 13th, John Makowski 14th, Todd Napiwocki 18th, Chris Fiedler 28th and Scott Meulemans 29th. Andy Christian and Jeff Enz were other runners.

Neenah didn't have enough runners to field a team in the girls' jayvee meet but Lynn Moede was sixth, Robyn Goudreau 10th and Jan Schaper 24th.

The Fox Valley Association meet at Kaukauna's Countryside Golf Course Thursday afternoon is next on the docket for both teams.

NHS harriers eye 20th meet verdict

MENASHA-NEENAH — The Neenah girls' cross country team bids for its 20th consecutive invitational victory when it competes at Fort Atkinson Saturday.

The Neenah girls, unbeaten in eight meets this season, haven't lost an invitational since the 1979 season.

The four junior varsity teams will meet at the same times in the Armstrong Fieldhouse.

Menasha's cross country team will be idle this weekend.

Neenah sweeps FVA cross country team titles

KAUKAUNA — Neenah's varsity boys' and girls' teams fought off windy weather to successfully defend their championships in the Fox Valley Association cross country meet Thursday afternoon at Countryside Golf Course.

The fourth consecutive FVA victory for the Neenah girls, ranked No. 1 in the state, came as no surprise, but the Rocket boys' second title in a row was a mild upset, since Appleton East is rated No. 11 in the state and Neenah is unranked.

A recurring injury to East junior Don Grogan proved crucial to the outcome of the boys' race. Grogan, who was expected to finish in the top 10, slipped and fell, aggravating an injury to his right leg, about 1 1/4 miles into the 5,000-meter (3.1-mile) race. Although he got back up and continued to run, he limped across the finish line in 54th place.

Had Grogan been able to do as well as was expected, East could have overcome the 43-48 victory claimed by the Rockets.

"We got a bad break," said East Coach Joe Perez. "I'm sure Grogan would have been in the top 10. With him I'm almost sure we would have

won. Our first four people ran very well, placing in the top 10. Our fifth guy was 21st, and that hurt."

Neenah won with balance. Ted Owen placed fourth, Eric Oakley fifth, Bill Jarosh sixth, Tom Schaper 12th and Erik Scribner 16th. Neenah's top five entrants all ran between 16:19 and 16:51.

"It was a real team effort. We've got seven kids with a lot of heart. We don't necessarily have that No. 1 runner, although I feel he have the guys that could be and I don't mean that in a negative sense. But we do run as a team and that's the name of the game," said Neenah Coach Tom Jensen.

"We've had our problems this year. We don't spend our life on mountain tops. Most of the time, we've been in the valleys," Jensen added. "But our sixth man finished ahead of East's fifth and that made the difference. We knew this meet was going to go down to four or five points."

Appleton West junior Brett Burt was the individual winner in 15:39.

"I wanted to stay behind Keith Timm (of Oshkosh West) and Jamie Pollard (Oshkosh North) because they usually go out pretty fast. I

wanted to take them at about the 1 1/2 mile point," Burt said. "I passed Timm after about a mile or so because I was feeling pretty good."

East's Jeff Mortier was second, while teammates Jim DuBord, Kevin Brice and Dave Holten placed seventh, eighth and 10th, respectively.

Neenah was the runaway winner in the varsity girls' race with 20 points. Menasha was second with 57. The Rockets garnered six of the top eight places, even though they ran without talented Colette Goudreau, who was withheld from the 3,200-meter event due to soreness in her legs. Coach Ron Fedenko hopes she can be ready for the sectional meet.

The Schaller sisters, Kathy and Eileen, gave Neenah a 1-2 finish individually. Kathy, a senior who was third in the FVA meet last year, won in 11:13. Menasha's Becky Boegh was third.

Neenah's Kathy Monard was fourth, while twin sisters Kris and Sue Burr were sixth and seventh, respectively.

Kathy Schaller said she wanted to get in front, set a fast pace and keep increasing the lead, which is precisely what she did. She was surprised that none of her competitors broke to a fast start.

NHS harriers defend titles in FVA meets

NEENAH — The Neenah boys' and girls' cross country teams defend their Fox Valley Association championships in the circuit's 13th annual meet on the Countryside Golf Course at Kaukauna Thursday.

An open class for boys and girls not in the varsity or jayvee races will be held at 3:30 p.m. The boys' jayvee race is scheduled for 4 o'clock, the boys' varsity event at 4:30 and the girls' varsity at 5 p.m. There will be no girls' junior varsity meet.

The Neenah girls, unbeaten in 21 meets in the last two years, are seeking their fifth conference title in the six-year history of the meet.

They won with a perfect 15 points in 1981. Menasha was second with 64.

Because of an injury, the Rockets probably will be without Colette Goudreau, who won the meet the previous three years.

Unbeaten Kathy Schaller was third last year, Kris Burr fourth, Kathy Monard fifth and Sue Burr sixth. Menasha's Becky Boegh seventh and Joan Swanson eighth. Patti Fredrick, Neenah's second placer, has graduated.

Neenah won previous championships in 1977, 1979 and 1980. The Bluejays copped in 1978.

The boys' race is expected to be considerably tighter since the Rockets, Appleton East and Appleton West have matched up well in previous meets this fall.

Neenah won by 36 points over the Patriots a year ago but individual winner Paul Meulemans has graduated.

Of the Rocket returnees, Ted Owen was sixth and Bill Jarosh seventh. Eric Oakley, Neenah's top runner in recent meets, didn't compete.

East brings back three of its runners, who finished in the top 10.

The conference's individual star this fall has been Appleton West's Brett Burt.

Neenah previously took championships in 1970, 1974, 1975, 1976 and 1978. It shared the 1971 crown with Appleton East and the latter claimed solo titles in 1972, 1973, 1977 and 1979. Kaukauna won in 1980.

it didn't appear that anybody wanted to take the lead," she said. Was it her best race of the season? "It's hard to say, because I usually tend to do better when somebody's pushing me," she replied.

"Kathy's done a super job all year long. She really deserved it," Fedenko said. "All of our girls work hard. They run all summer. That's the key."
