At Grafton Invitational

NHS girls gain 19th win

NEENAH — The state's No. 1 ranked high school girls' cross country team continued its domination of invitational meets by posting a perfect score in the Blackhawk Invitational at Grafton Saturday.

In winning their 19th invitational in a row, Neenah sent its first seven entries through the chute in front of every runner from every other school to win with the lowest possible total of 15 points. It was their third straight 15-point win.

West Bend East finished in second place with 96 points, followed by West Allis Central 102, Fond du Lac 113, Kettle-Moraine 121, Menomonee Falls North 122 and Nicolet 168.

Kathy Schaller, who is still un-

beaten, made it seventh straight by winning in 11:32.

Colette Goudreau was second in 12:01, Kathy Monard third in 12:07, Eileen Schaller fourth in 12:09, Joan Swanson fifth in 12:12, Sue Burr sixth in 12:13 and Kris Burr seventh in 12:16.

Lyn Moede, Neenah's, eighth runner, was 19th in 13:18.

The Neenah boys' team placed fourth but only one point out of third.

Nicolet took first place with 44 points. Thomas More had 71, Marquette 89, Neenah 90, West Bend East 124, Sussex-Hamilton 142, West Allis Central 163, Menomonee Falls North 234 and Menomonee Falls East 235.

Ted Owen was 10th in 17:05, Eric Oakley 12th in 17:06, Bill Jarosh 17th in 17:14, Tom Schaper 24th in 17:32, John Boudry 27th in 17:37, Erik Scribner 30th in 17:49, Tom Lamb 52nd in 18:40 and Jim Lamb 54th in 18:54.

Mike Simmons of Thomas More was the individual winner.

"It really was impressive to see the girls finish in a line from one through seven," girls' Coach Ron Fedenko said.

Fedenko pointed out that Kathy Schaller is getting stronger every race, that Monard's third was her best finish and, for the first time, Sue Burr defeated her twin sister, Kris.

The Rocket coach added that the jayvees also ran well. Amy Rusch was first in 13:14 and Robyn Goudreau second in 13:35. Jan Schaper was 12th.

"Our boys responded well to the competition. We ran a lot better than we did at Wauwatosa," Coach Tom Jensen said of the boys' meet.

"We ran aggressively. We were only one point out of third place. Thomas More was ranked sixth, Nicolet seventh and Marquette was just out of the top 10 last week," he added.

"We can run with teams in the top 10 and not get blown away. We've got confidence," he concluded.

Sussex-Hamilton took the jayvee meet with 35 points. Marquette had 45, West Bend East 113, Neenah 115, Menomonee Falls North 160 and West Allis Central 206.

Neenah places were Alex Collins 14th, Chris Fiedler 15th, Scott Meulemans 21st, Jeff Enz 25th, Todd Napiwocki 40th and Jeff Wheeler 50th.

Running unattached were Kevin Shadduck, John Makowski, Pat Shadoney, John Kidd, Bill Hammet and Rob Wilson.

Shadduck posted an 18:15, Wilson 18:42 and Makowski 18:45.

The Neenah boys' and girls' teams will run against Kaukauna, Kimberly and Menasha at the Countryside Golf Course Tuesday afternoon.

**NHS runners bid for
19th successive
invitational win**

NEENAH-MENASHA — The Neenah girls' cross country team bids for its 19th straight invitational victory when it competes at Grafton Saturday.

Other entries are Kettle-Moraine, Fond du Lac, Menomonee Falls East, Menomonee Falls North, West Allis Central and Nicolet.

Teams in the boys' meet are Marquette, Menomonee Falls East and North, Nicolet, Sussex-Hamilton, Thomas More and West Allis Central.

The girls' varsity race is scheduled at 8:45 a.m. and the boys will race at 9:45.

Menasha's boys and girls will travel to Racine to take part in the Eagle Invitational. They'll go against teams mainly from the Racine and Kenosha area.

St. Mary Central's netters entertain Springs at 5:15 p.m. today at St. Patrick when they bid for their eighth consecutive Fox Valley Christian Conference triumph.

The Neenah boys' volleyball team, victorious in the Fort Atkinson Invitational in its last start, will take part in the Kaukauna tournament Saturday.

The Neenah girls' swimming team will compete in D.C. Everest Invitational at Schofield.

Other Saturday activities include the Menasha Girls' Volleyball Invitational and the WISAA girls' tennis regional at Fond du Lac.

NHS cross country teams finish first; Menasha girls 2nd

KAUKAUNA — Its string of perfect scores was stopped at three but the Neenah girls' cross country team remained unbeaten by outrunning three Fox Valley Association rivals on the Countryside Golf Course Tuesday afternoon.

Joining Neenah's young ladies in the victory circle was the boys' squad, which won its third straight meet against all-FVA competition.

The girls collected 17 points, two shy of perfect. Menasha finished second with 50, Kaukauna Black 85, Kimberly 127 and Kaukauna White 145.

Kathy Schaller, for the eighth straight meet, finished in first place. Her time was 10:33.

Schaller's sophomore sister, Eileen, was second in 10:53, Kathy Monard third in 10:55, Menasha's Becky Boegh fourth, Joan Swanson fifth, Collette Goudreau sixth, Kris Burr seventh and Sue Burr eighth.

Completing the top 10 were Menasha's Sara Morawek ninth and Kelly Owen 10th. Jill Jackson was 11th, Therese Mulder 16th and Jodi VanderWielen 20th.

It was a fine effort for Boegh, who, in two previous races against the Neenah girls, just finished outside the top five.

Neenah's Lyn Moede was 12th, Amy Rusch 17th and Jan Schaper 26th.

The Neenah boys racked up 20 points to Kaukauna's 54, Menasha's 70 and 77 for Kimberly.

Eric Oakley of the Rockets garnered first place in 15:54. Teammate Ted Owen ranked second in 16:08.

Other Neenah places were Tom Schaper sixth in 16:38, Eric Scribner

seventh in 16:48 and Kevin Shaddock 11th. John Boudry didn't run because of illness.

Kimberly's Dan Siegel, who challenged Oakley and Owen through the first half of the race, finished third. Kaukauna's Kevin Hohn was fifth.

Menasha's Craig Noffke broke into the top 10 with an eighth place finish. John Rohr placed 14th, Mike Madsen 15th, Todd Mason 16th, Pete Schwonek 17th, Tim Giebink 23rd and John Kopitzke 26th.

Neenah's No. 1 team finished first in the junior varsity race with 37 points. Neenah No. 2 had 47, Kaukauna 53, Menasha 87 and Kimberly 116.

First place was taken by the Bluejays' John Strand in 17:47.

Places for Neenah's No. 1 team were Alex Collins second, Chris Fiedler third, Scott Meulemans fifth, Todd Napiwocki ninth, Jeff Enz 17th, Andy Christian 21st and Jeff Wheeler 25th.
