NHS girls win 'Tosa run

NEENAH — The defending champion Neenah girls' cross country team outclassed a strong field to win the Wauwatosa East Invitational Saturday.

Led by Kathy Schaller, who won her fourth straight race, the Rockets accumulated 21 points to 56 for runner-up Homestead.

Racine Case was third with 87, followed by Manitowoc 95, Waukesha South 103 and Wauwatosa East 182.

Menomonee Falls North annexed boys' honors with 42 points. The Rockets finished seventh with 195.

Other team scores were Wauwatosa East 58, Milwaukee Thomas More 199, Waukesha South 115, Milwaukee Marquette 136, Racine Case 149, Milwaukee South 201, Homestead 216,

Manitowoc 217 and Glendale 251.

Schaller, in remaining unbeaten, set a course record of 11:27. The old mark was 11:56.

Third place Joan Swanson also eclipsed the old mark with her 11:54 and Colette Goudreau tied it in finishing fourth.

Other Rocket places were Eileen Schaller sixth in 12:03, Kathy Monard seventh in 12:10, Kris Burr ninth in 12:18, Sue Burr 13th in 12:26 and Amy Rusch 32nd in 13:30.

Holly Hering of Homestead was second in 11:43, Julie Schlitz, Homestead, fifth in 11:59, Chris Scimemi, Manitowoc, eighth and Chris Kirchen, Manitowoc, 10th.

Rocket Coach Ron Fedenko said Schaller, Goudreau and Hering were

running shoulder to shoulder at the mile mark but a short time later Schaller had a lead of from 10 to 15 yards.

Fedenko pointed out that the course had more hills than the Rockets are used to running on.

He added that the Rocket girls are challenging each other for positions, noting that Swanson moved up to third after finishing eighth last week.

Ted Owen was 17th in 17:02 to lead the Rocket finishers in the boys' race.

Eric Oakley placed 33rd in 17:23, Erik Scribner 46th in 17:39, John Boudry 49th in 17:42, Bill Jarosh 51st in 17:44, Tom Schaper 61st in 17:52, Tom Lamb 75th in 18:16 and Jim Lamb 76th in 18:17.

Thomas More's Mike Simmons was the winner in 15:54.

"It was an awfully powerful field. Menomonee Falls East was ranked second last week, Wauwatosa East, fourth, Thomas More sixth, Manitowoc 10th and Racine Case 13th," Coach Tom Jensen revealed.

"It's hard to finish high when you don't have anyone in the top 10. We can run but better but this was about a tough a field as you can get," Jensen stated.

Neenah's jayvee boys' team finished sixth in a field of 11 with 144 points. Menomonee Falls North won with 61.

Rocket placed were Kevin Shaduck 13th, Rob Wilson 26th, Alex Collins 27th, Scott Meulemans 38th, John Makowski 40th, Pat Shandonay 44th, John Kidd 51st, Andy Christian 56th, Jeff Enz 76th, Jeff Wheeler 102nd and Bill Hammet 109th.

Times of Rocket girls running in the jayvee race were Lyn Moede 13:34, Robyn Goudreau 13:32 and Jan Schaper 15:02.
