## Neenah girls capture 1st place in Grafton cross country meet

GRAFTON — The Neenah girls' cross country team, which had its string of invitationals halted by Stevens Point a week earlier, started another by dominating the field in the Blackhawk Invitational here Saturday.

The Rockets claimed the first 6 places and 8 of the first 10 in recording 15 points.

Kettle-Moraine was a distant second with 84, followed by West Allis Central 99, West Bend East 101, Germantown 125 and Nicolet 136.

Neenah's Eileen Schaller was the individual winner in 12:10, finishing 17 seconds ahead of teammate Kris Burr.

Kathy Monard took third in 12:32, followed by Sue Burr 12:52, Joan Swanson 12:59 and Amy Garlock 13:05.

West Bend East's Lisa Stoddard was seventh, Mary Konkol, West Allis Hale, eighth, Neenah's Jill Camber ninth in 13:24 and Cathy Gilmore 10th in 13:34.

The Neenah boys garnered third place with 81 points, trailing Nicolet (58) and West Bend East (59).

Sussex-Hamilton was fourth with 92, followed by Thomas More 125.

Germantown 177, Marquette 191, West Allis Central 196 and Menomonee Falls North 209.

Menomonee Falls North has one of the top teams in the state but split up its runners and brought a reserve group here.

Ted Balistreri of Nicolet was first in 16:32. Teammate Eric Wellwood finished second in 16:42.

Neenah's Eric Oakley took third in 16:58, Tom Schaper fourth in 17:13, Erik Scribner 12th in 17:40, Jim Lamb 28th in 18:16, Todd Meulemans 34th in 18:29, Todd Napiwocki 42nd in 18:46, Alex Collins 44th in 18:35 and Bill Hammett 63rd in 20:09.

"The girls ran well but there was only six teams and there wasn't much competition," Neenah Coach Ron Fedenko said.

Fedenko lauded Monard and Garlock for their performances.

Coach Tom Jensen said his top three runners (Oakley, Schaper and Scribner) ran well and he was pleased with the third place finish, one of the highest of the fall.

Neenah's Kathy Burr was first in the jayvee race in 14:40. Jan Schaper placed second and Karen Rieden 11th.

The Neenah junior varsity boys' team garnered third place.

Brian LeGault was seventh, Rob Wilson 12th, Jeff Wheeler 16th, Alex Scribner 25th, Glen Smith 26th, Mike Halverson 28th, Jeff Enz 42nd, Darin Schoening 49th and Ben Christian 66th.

The Rocket teams will compete with Menasha, Kaukauna and Appleton East at Kaukauna Tuesday afternoon. They'll run in the Fort Atkinson Invitational next Saturday.
