SHAWANO — The Neenah boys' cross country team finished third with 83 points in the Shawano Invitational Saturday, while Green Bay Preble was first with 57 points and Manitowoc second with 61.

Eric Oakley led Neenah with a fourth-place finish while teammate Tom Schaper was ninth. Jim Lamb was 17th, Erik Scribner 18th, Scott Meulemans 35th, Rob Wilson 42nd, Bill Hammett 63rd, and Glen Smith 64th.

Neenah placed fifth last year in the meet.

Doug Swanke took 12th overall and led Oshkosh North to a fifth-place finish with 133 points. Hugh Sanders was 25th, Dave Polishinski 29th, Mason Young 31st, Mike Burr 36th, Mark Weiland 48th and Brian Marquardt 67th.

In the jayvee meet, which Green Bay Preble won with 28 points, Neenah was seventh with 187 and Oshkosh North 11th with 294. Brian LeGault of Neenah was ninth overall while Dave Mieaswa paced Oshkosh North to 35th overall.

SHAWANO — The Neenah girls' cross country team won its third straight Shawano Invitational cross country meet Saturday, and its 27th meet win in a row, while Oshkosh North finished sixth.

Neenah runners keep perfect 3-year mark

NEENAH — The Neenah High School girls' cross country team made it three for three this season by winning the Shawano Invitational Saturday.

The Neenah girls, who have won 27 straight meets spanning three seasons and 22 consecutive invitationals, collected 23 points to 74 for runnerup Green Bay Preble.

Manitowoc had 89, Wausau East 136, Green Bay East 153, Oshkosh North 167, Preble No. 2 203, Antigo 252, Wisconsin Rapids 280, Manitowoc No. 2 299 and Wausau West 306.

The Neenah boys posted their best invitational finish of the season in placing third.

Preble won the meet with 57 points, followed by Manitowoc 61, Neenah 83, Green Bay East 99, Oshkosh North 133, Wausau East 138, Wausau West 185, Wisconsin Rapids 196 and Antigo 218.

Girls' individual honors for the third straight meet went to the Rockets' Eileen Schaller in 11:30.

Meghan McCarthy of Oshkosh North finished second in 11:43 and Kris Burr of the Rockets came home third in 12:01.

Kathy Monard was fourth in 12:02, Joan Swanson sixth in 12:05, Sue Burr ninth in 12:12, Lyn Moede 23rd in 12:59, Amy Garlock 25th in 13:00, Kathy Gilmore 34th in 13:30, Jill Camber 39th in 13:47, Kathy Burr 40th in 13:49, Jan Schaper 55th in 14:21 and Karen Reiden 83rd.

Mike Barrett of Green Bay East was the boys' winner in 16:18.

The Rockets' Eric Oakley placed fourth in 16:46.

Other Neenah places were Tom Schaper ninth, Jim Lamb 17th, Erik Scribner 18th, Scott Meulemans 35th, Rob Wilson 47th, Bill Hammet 63rd and Glen Smith 64th.

Schaller led by about 15 yards at the mile mark and maintained that spread most of the race.

Coach Ron Fedenko said at the mile split his first five runners were in a group. He also was encouraged by the performances of freshmen Garlock and Gilmore, noting that last year the Rockets didn't have any ninth graders on the squad.

The Rockets, who were ranked first in all of the state cross country coaches' polls last fall, were rated second behind Stevens Point in last week's initial voting.

"I think it is fair. We lost two seniors (Colette Goudreau and Kathy Schaller) and they have everyone

back," Fedenko said.

"It will take a little pressure off," he added.

Boys' Coach Tom Jensen also was pleased with the performances of his runners.

In addition to Oakley and Schaper finishing in the top 10, Jensen noted that Jim Lamb ran 1½ minutes better than he did on the same course last year.

"Oakley was 17th last year. The top five show significant improvement over last year," Jensen explained.

Neenah's jayvee boys' team finished seventh with 187 points. Preble was first with 28.

The Rockets' Brian LeGault was ninth, Alex Scribner 28th, Darin Schoening 41st, Jeff Enz 53rd and Mike Halverson 56th.

The Neenah teams will compete in the Wauwatosa East Invitational next Saturday.
