Rockets, Jays exchange upsets in cross country

NEENAH — The Menasha girls and Neenah boys recorded upsets when the Twin City cross country squads met in their traditional opener at Memorial Park Tuesday afternoon.

The Bluejay and Rocket girls were deadlocked 28-28 but, on the tie-breaker, Menasha was declared the winner.

Neenah's boys, who lost every meet last year and were blanked by the Menashans in the opener, surprised the veteran Bluejays 22-33.

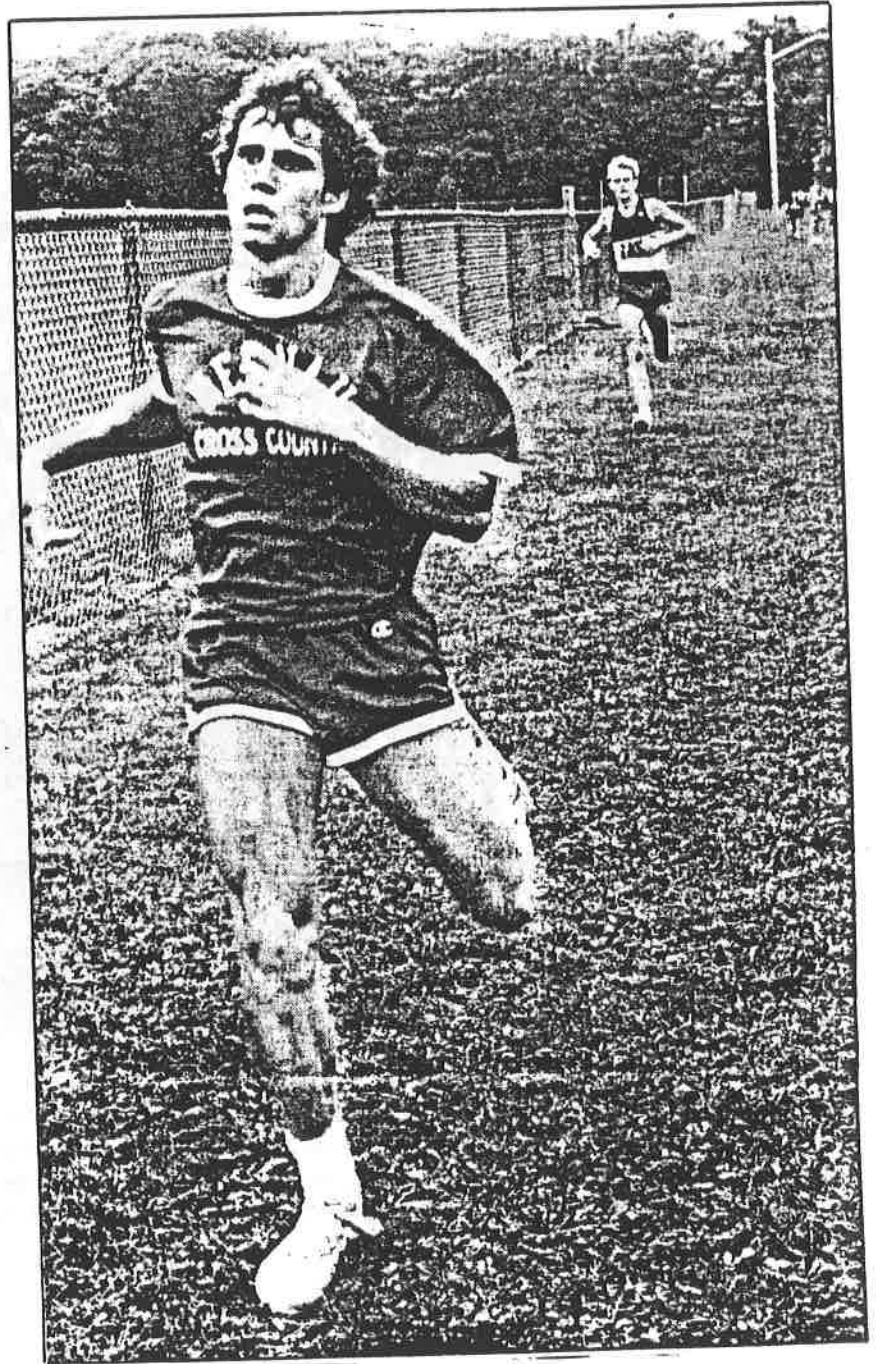
For the Rocket girls, the loss was their first since 1978 in a meet in which less than 8 teams participated. The Bluejays also handed them their setback then.

In the last 5 years, Neenah's only losses were to Madison Memorial in the 1980 and 1984 state meets and to Stevens Point in the Kettle Moraine Invitational 2 years ago.

First place in Tuesday's dual went to Neenah sophomore Jenny Owens in 12:25. Teammate Amy Garlock finished second in 12:53.

The deadlock was broken when Menasha's sixth-placer finished 10th to the Rockets' 12th.

Marty Netzel, Neenah's conference 800 and 1600-meter champion, who was on the football team last year, edged the Bluejays' Tom Severson in the boys' race.

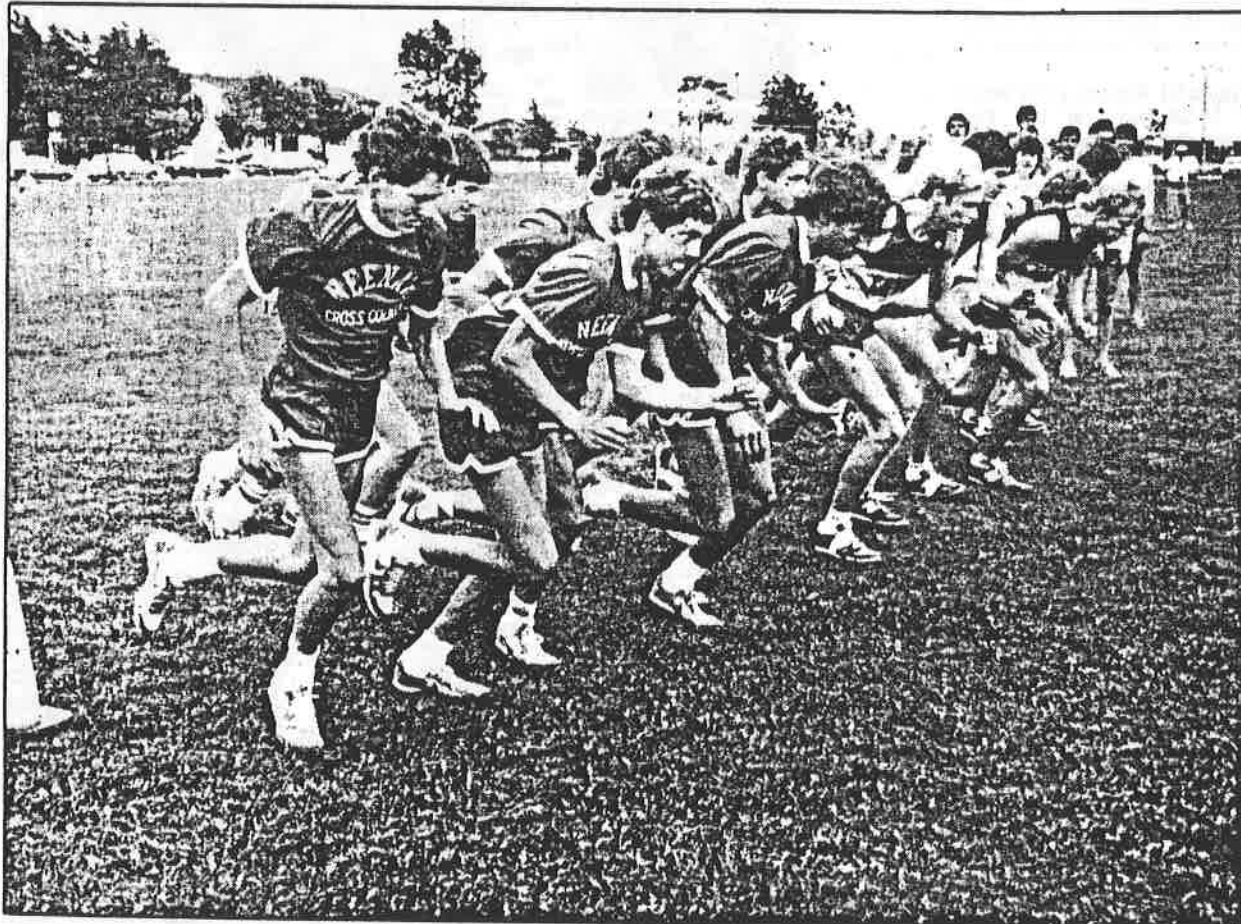
