Newcomers help NHS cross country team

NEENAH — "We'll be a better team, but we don't have the depth. I hope we can finish in the middle of the conference."

That's the prospect for the Neenah High School boys' cross country season, according to Coach Tom Jensen.

"We were down so far that it will take time to get back up there," Jensen, whose Rockets went through a winless campaign in 1984, stated.

Prospects for the future are encouraging because of the junior high school program that was inaugurated last fall.

Six freshmen have been working out, and more are expected when classes begin later this week. The group is larger than any in recent years, Jensen reported.

The squad also includes several sophomores. There were no freshmen on the 1984 roster.

Returning letterwinners are seniors Scott Meulemans, last year's most valuable runner, and Jeff Wheeler and juniors Alex Scribner and Russ Stern.

Junior Barry Tebon was on the team a year ago but didn't earn a letter.

Jensen said it is important for Meulemans to stay healthy, noting that injury problems hampered him both in cross country and track last year.

Several newcomers are expected to break into the opening lineup.

Marty Netzel, conference 800 and 1,600 meter champion, was on the football team last year, while Jeff

Reeve, a sophomore, transferred from Cincinnati.

"Netzel had the ninth best time in the state in the 800 last spring, but there is a big difference between 800 meters and 5,000 meters," Jensen pointed out.

Other senior candidates are Bob Haushalter, who also was on the football squad, William Smith, a transfer from New Orleans, and Jay Kessen, who ran track last spring.

Scribner, Stern and Tebon are the only juniors on the team, while Harry Miller is a sophomore candidate.

Freshmen include Mike Getzlaff, Kevin Voss, John Paske, John Hodges, Todd Kriese and Scott Hauser.

There were only 11 runners in all four classes on last year's roster.

Graduates were Jeff Enz, Pete Dunlavy, Ben Christian, Alex Collins and Glen Smith.

Jensen expects Menasha, Appleton East and Appleton West to be the strong teams in the conference.

The Rockets will debut with a home meet against Menasha next Tuesday.

The schedule will be the same as last year except for a Waukesha Invitational, which replaces the Fort Atkinson meet.
