Church, Weiland win harrier titles

Tiffany Church, a senior from Appleton West, turned in a sparkling performance Saturday, topping the list of accomplishments for area cross country runners at WIAA sectional meets.

Church finished first in the Class A sectional at Rhinelander with a time of 11:57. She thus qualifies for the state meet next Saturday in Madison.

The top six individuals and top two teams from each of the sectionals will advance to the state meet, which will be held at Yahara Hills golf course.

Joining Church at the state meet will be teammate Kris Helein, who finished sixth at Rhinelander. The Terrors failed to qualify as a team, though, as they finished sixth with 153 points.

Shawano's Kim Bruckner and New London's Jeff Shaw also earned trips to the state meet at Rhinelander.

The Neenah girls' team failed to qualify for state for the first time in six years when it finished fifth at Manitowoc.

Neenah had won five consecutive sectional championships and took three state titles and two seconds during that span.

Beaver Dam and Two Rivers qualified by scoring 76 and 122 points, respectively. The Rockets, with 142, points finished one place behind Kaukauna (134).

The Rockets' No. 1 runner, Jenny Owens, dropped out of the race at the 1 1/4-mile mark.

Individual honors went to Oshkosh North's Beth Weiland in 12:12. Also qualifying was Cherste Johnson of Oshkosh West, who placed fifth.

Surprising Sheboygan North, which finished fourth in the Fox River Valley Conference meet, won the boys' championship with 37 points.

Favored Manitowoc, seeking its fourth straight sectional crown, was second with 52.

Neenah, last a year ago, finished fourth with 171 points although conference runner-up Marty Netzel didn't run because of an injury.

Individual honors went to Dean Rhode of New Holstein in 16:43. Fox Valley Association champion Tom Severson of Menasha placed ninth.

Ken Wyngaard of Little Chute paced area Class B participants at Wittenberg-Birnamwood with a third-place finish. Freedom's Dave Hammond and Wittenberg-Birnamwood's Kelly Shepherd also qualified for state with sixth-place finishes.

The only area Class C state-bound runner is Hilbert's Barbie Bangart, who finished third at the Princeton sectional.
