NHS runners qualify for state

NEENAH-MENASHA. — The cross country season closed for all but two Neenah runners in the WIAA sectional at Fond du Lac Saturday.

Jenny Owens and Kayann Monard qualified for the state meet at Madison Saturday by finishing fourth and fifth, respectively, in sectional competition.

The top two teams and first six individual performers qualified for the state finals.

Erica Larson of Fond du Lac took first place in 12:01. Owens was clocked in 12:21 and Monard in 12:22.

They trailed Two Rivers' Trina Taddy, the second-placer, and Missy Langlois of Manitowoc, who finished third.

Little Ten Conference entries Beaver Dam and Waupun qualified their teams with 74 and 92 points, respectively.

Neenah finished sixth with 146 points and Menasha was 13th with 344.

It will be the second state meet trip for Owens and the first for Monard, a sophomore. Owens, a junior, was a member of the 1984 team that finished second. The Rockets didn't qualify anyone last fall.

Fox River Valley Conference entries Manitowoc and Fond du Lac led the boys' meet with 63 and 75 points, respectively.

The Rockets finished ninth with 241 points and the Bluejays were 15th with 388.

Neenah's Jeff Reeve was the best Twin City finisher with a 17th place.

A pair of newcomers to the WIAA State Cross Country meet highlighted area performances at Yahara Hills Golf Course in Madison Saturday.

Appleton West sophomore Kristen Bubolz took fourth in the girls Class A run with a time of 11:30.2 for the highest area finish and Brillion's Ryan Reichardt captured a fifth place in the boys Class B race with a 16:25.3 effort.

Bubolz' and Reichardt's efforts headed a list of five top-10 finishes by local runners at the state meet.

Steve Jones of Appleton East and Neenah's Jenny Owens claimed eighth place finishes in Class A boys and girls, respectively, while Freedom's Dave Hammond had a ninth place run in Class B boys.

The Appleton East team finished 12th in the meet, while Neenah's Kay Monard grabbed a 19th place finish in Class A and Wrightstown's Diana Wiegert finished 18th in Class B. East' freshman Britt Garton notched a 45th place finish.

Burlington's Lee Zubord carded his second straight Class A championship with a clocking of 15:53.0, while

Clare Eichner of Wauwatosa East took the girls' Class A crown with an 11:13.6 clocking. Slinger's Diane Breuer (11:57.7) won the Class B event and Auburndale's Tricia Breu (11:54.2) headed up the Class C girls' competition.

Brookfield Central placed three runners in the top 30 to win the Class A team championship. Five finishes in the top 50 gave Clinton the Class C crown, and two top 20 efforts aided Darlington's victory in Class C.

Homestead edged La Crosse Central by one point to win the girls' Class A division. Phillips took the top honors in Class B and Prentice placed five runners in the first 23 finishers to win the Class C championship.

Owens, who finished fourth in the Fond du Lac sectional, was locked in a battle with Green Bay Sectional winner Tricia Lax, and third place finisher April Elke for seventh place before Lax edged out Owens by a .5 margin. Owens' teammate, Kay Monard, finished 19th in the race.

"I figured she should be in the top 10," Neenah Coach Ron Fedenko said of Owens. "She was running in sixth until she got passed in the straightaway. She ran a real good race."
