Rocket runners bid for 9th league title

NEENAH — The Neenah girls' cross country team seeks its second straight Fox Valley Association championship and its ninth in the 11-year history of the meet at Kaukauna Thursday afternoon.

Menasha (1978) and Kaukauna (1985) were the only other league champions.

Returning for the Rockets are senior Jenny Owens, second the last two years and sixth as a freshman in 1984, and junior Kayann Monard, eighth as a freshman and third last fall.

Owens, who missed two meets because of a foot injury, returned to action and placed first in the Waukesha Memorial Crusader Invitational last Saturday. She finished 15 seconds ahead of Appleton East's Jenny Alby.

Waukesha Memorial won the meet with 86 points. The Rockets were third with 111.

Competing without Owens, the Neenah girls placed second in a quadrangular at Kaukauna. The Ghosts totaled 30 points to 57 for Neenah. Monard finished second in 12:09 behind Appleton West's Kristen Bubolz (11:49).

The St. Mary girls took second place in the Indian Relays at Weyauwega-Fremont with 70 minutes, 18 seconds. Hortonville won with 61.29. Becky Otto garnered third place.

The Zephyr girls have finished first

or second in their last three meets.

The Neenah boys bested Kaukauna 30 to 40 to win the quadrangular that also involved Appleton West and Oshkosh West. The Rockets placed five runners in the top 10, led by Aaron Pues' third.

The Neenah boys were eighth at Waukesha with 186 points. Grafton was first with 66. None of the Neenah runners finished in the top 10.

The Rocket boys were third in last year's conference meet. Jeff Reeve finished fourth. They've won eight conference crowns, the last one in 1982. Appleton East has copped the last four.

The Menasha girls were second to Appleton East (39 to 47) in a quadrangular also involving Oshkosh North and Kimberly. Kari Sturtivant finished fourth.

The Bluejay boys were fourth in the same quadrangular, despite Todd Arndt's second place.

Menasha's girls were seventh and the boys eighth in last year's conference meet.

Mahmoud has strong race

KAUKAUNA — The confidence is building in Oshkosh North cross country runner Julie Mahmoud.

Mahmoud's confidence has North Coach Chuck Reigel cautioning opponents to beware.

As expected, Appleton West's Kristen Bubolz and Neenah's Jenny Owens finished 1-2 in the girls portion of the Fox Valley Association cross country meet at Countryside Golf Course Thursday.

But in a surprise, Mahmoud led the pack at the halfway mark of the 3,200-meter run and finished a strong third.

"That was far and away her best run ever," Reigel said of Mahmoud's performance. "Bubolz is a natural and will probably finish in the top three in the state. But I don't think Jenny Owens should relax too much yet."

Bubolz won her second consecutive FVA title in 11 minutes, 8 seconds, followed by Owens in 11:15. Mahmoud finished in 11:28, nearly a half a minute better than her previous best time.

Appleton East won the girls title — the first in school history — with 54 points. Kaukauna took second with 56, followed by Appleton West with 73, Neenah, 75;

Oshkosh West, 142; Oshkosh North, 156; Menasha, 166; and Kimberly, 221.

For the boys, North came within 16 points of dethroning defending FVA champion Appleton East, which had 47 points.

The North boys were second with 63, followed by Neenah with 82, Kaukauna, 102; Kimberly, 127; Appleton West, 129; Menasha, 152; and Oshkosh West, 233.

Both the girls and boys teams will compete in the Sheboygan Sectional Oct. 24. The top two teams and the top six individuals in the sectional will advance to the state meet Oct. 31.

Owens said she and Bubolz suffered from a slow start, but said she was surprised Mahmoud ran such a strong race.

"We (Bubolz and Owens) had a lot of catching up to do," Owens said. "Julie (Mahmoud) is a good runner, but she really ran well today."

Reigel, however, discarded the notion that Owens and Bubolz started slowly, and instead gave credit to Mahmoud.

"Julie just took it out," Reigel said. "I told her to do that — to take the lead. It was a little dif-

ferent tactic and it almost worked. She is going to do well in sectionals."

Mahmoud said she was running a lot faster than she believed she could.

"I just run how I feel and I was feeling good," Mahmoud said. "My confidence and attitude is really up and I hope I can get to state. I feel that I probably can."

North's top finisher behind Mahmoud was Lauri Nigl, who took 30th in 13:17.

Neenah's Kay Monard placed fifth in 11:45, while West's top finisher was Beth Binder, who took 20th in 12:37.

"It felt great. It was my best time ever," said Binder, whose previous best was 12:50. "But everybody was so fast. I just wanted to finish without falling down."

Several West runners set personal bests, including Heidi Neusfister (13:07), Cindy Pahlow (13:11), Amy Leiby (13:19) and Nicki Zdanovec (13:26).

In the boys race, Appleton East placed Jeff Glasheen (16:16) and Brian Sass (16:26) second and third, respectively, to claim their fifth straight conference crown with 47 points.

Kaukauna's Mike James won the individual title in 16:12 in the 5,000-meter race.

Jason Ryf led the North Spartans with a sixth place finish in 16:36. Two other North runners made the top 10, with Mike Misterek taking ninth in 16:43 and Joe Knox 10th in 16:44.

"We had hoped to win it and we thought we would have to have four people in the top 10 to do it," Reigel said. "We got three, and the kids did about as well as they could. We were disappointed not to win it, but you couldn't ask much more out of the guys."

"I was hoping for the top 10, so I'm happy," said Ryf, a junior. "We're hoping we can place the team in sectionals next week."

Neenah's Aaron Pues placed seventh in 16:37. Oshkosh West's highest finisher was Mike Burman, who took 33rd in 18:12.
