Juniors key NHS runners

NEENAH — Seven returning lettermen form the foundation for the Neenah High School boys' cross country team, which will compete in the Hodag Invitational at Rhinelander Saturday.

Senior Jeff Reeve finished fourth in the Fox Valley Association meet last October and was chosen co-most valuable runner on the squad with the graduated Alex Scribner.

Other returnees are Todd Kriese, Reid Johnson, John Paske, Aaron Pues, Steve Scherck and John Hodges, all juniors.

Other squad members include Tim Schinker, Rob Owen, Pat Eifler and Ron Schimmel, seniors; Leland Anderson, Kevin Davis and Scott Hauser, juniors; Geoffrey Sutter, Tim Patterson, Jason Fisher and Sebastian Sample, sophomores, and Jim Swenson, John Carpenter, Jason Van Stippen, Mike Price, Jeremy Simon, Clark Dale and Brett Campbell, freshmen.

Of the non-lettermen, Sample was given the best chance to break into

the top seven.

"We've got a good group of juniors and have been getting leadership from Reeve," said Coach Tom Jensen.

"I think we can do well in many invitationals, but I don't know if we have the athlete capable of finishing in the top 10."

"We're a good team and we'll be an excellent team if we can get someone to place in the top 10," Jensen added.

The veteran coach is pleased with his turnout of 25 candidates, especially the freshmen, and said more may turn out at Shattuck.

Scribner and Barry Tebon were the only graduated lettermen.

Last year's team finished third in the conference meet and eighth in the sectional.

Glen Severson again is working with the junior varsity prospects.

Owens expected to be one of state's best

NEENAH — The Neenah High School girls' cross country team can field one of the state's outstanding runners, but, overall, the squad is inexperienced, according to veteran Coach Ron Fedenko.

The Rockets are led by 4-year veteran Jenny Owens, who finished second in the Fox Valley Association meet last fall and was eighth in the state. She was second in the 3200 in the state track Class A meet in spring.

"If she can stay injury-free, Jenny should be one of the best runners in the state. I'm looking for her to finish first in a good percentage of our meets," Fedenko said.

Teammate Kayann Monard, a junior, was third in the conference and 19th in the state run last fall.

Other returning letterwinners are junior Cheryl MacPhetridge and sophomore Kari Vedder.

Lynda Heinen and Paula Rider, a transfer from Menasha, join Owens as the only seniors on the team. Kate Pichon, a squad member last year, is the third junior.

Dawn Swanson, in addition to Vedder, are returning sophomores.

Sherry Maas and Cindy Sarnowski are newcomers.

Freshmen include Jodi Wilz, Jamie Molash, Heidi Johnson and Jackie Heinen. Several other ninth graders will run with the Shattuck Junior High School team.

"We're young and inexperienced. Six girls never ran cross country before, and a lot of them didn't run much during the summer," Fedenko explained.

Lost by the graduation route were Amy Garlock, Cathy Gilmore, Lori Jesse and Carolyn Heinen. Renee Johnson, another regular last year, didn't report.

The Rockets were slated to open their schedule against Menasha Tuesday afternoon and will compete in the Hodag Invitational at Rhinelander Saturday.
