Both Rocket harrier teams young

NEENAH — Youth characterizes both the Neenah High School boys' and girls' cross country squads.

Coach Ron Fedenko's girls' team only lists eight runners, and half are freshmen. Only three seniors are included on Coach Tom Jensen's boys' roster of 13.

The future appears bright for the boys because 12 freshmen are running for Coach Glen Severson at Shattuck, and several will compete with the jayvees in varsity invitationals.

The girls' team, which has produced All-American Colette Goudreau, Kathy Monard, Kathy and Eileen Schaller and Jenny Owens, all collegiate runners, returns only two letterwinners — Renee Hamilton and Jill Peterson.

Four-year regulars Kay Monard and Cheryl MacPhetridge were the only graduates but five other monogram winners didn't report. They include Angela Parker, who will miss the season because of an injury.

Newcomers include Brenda Johnson, Krista Lawell, Holly Knoll and Lisa Seaborne, freshmen, Carrie McKinnon and Chandra Ulbrich.

Because of the few numbers, the Rockets won't be able to enter any junior varsity meets.

"We're starting from scratch. Most of the girls didn't run much during the summer," said Fedenko, who is beginning his eighth season as girls' coach.

They bested Menasha 22 to 34 and finished 11th in the Rhinelander Invitational in their first two meets.

Johnson was second, Peterson third and Lawell fourth in the Menasha meet. Johnson's 27th was the leading place at Rhinelander.

Jensen, coaching the Rocket boys since 1968, graduated a talented group of two and three-year regulars from the 1988 third-place con-

ference team.

They included Aaron Pues, John Paske, John Hodges, Reid Johnson, Brett Carley and Todd Kriese.

Returning lettermen are seniors Sebastian Sample and Tim Patterson; junior John Carpenter and sophomore Tom Syverud.

Among the non-letterman returnees are Jim Swenson, Geoff Sutter, Eric Drumm, Erik Jensen and Brett Campbell. Newcomers include Vang Moua, Brian Mead, Ryan Huebner and Jason Van Stippen.

The Rockets bested Menasha 21 to 38 and took seventh place in the Rhinelander Invitational in their first two starts.

Syverud, Carpenter and Swenson were one-two-three in the dual, and Carpenter's 19th was tops at Rhinelander.

"We have only three seniors on the team, but the numbers will climb (because of the freshmen). Syverud is only a sophomore," Jensen said.

At the present time, the runners are about a minute off last year's pace, the veteran coach reported.

Except for the addition of Fond du Lac in the conference, the schedule for both Neenah teams is the same as last fall. They will compete in the Shawano Invitational Saturday.
