OSHKOSH — Neenah's Karen Schaper finished sixth in the Division 1 prep cross country sectional Saturday to lead the Rockets to a first-place team finish and a berth in the state meet next Saturday in Wisconsin Rapids.

Schaper finished the race in 12:52 and led four Rocket runners in the top 20. Julie Olson finished in 10th place, followed by Christy Codner at 15th and Missy Klabunde at 17th.

Meghan Patterson finished in 20th, Krista Lawell ended in 43rd and Julee Beckstrom finished 52nd to complete the Rocket runners.

Angie Gruendemann of Oshkosh West also was an individual qualifier, finishing fifth.

In the boys' run, Manitowoc edged Neenah by three points for second-place and the state berth that goes with it.

The top two teams and top six individuals advance to state from each sectional.

Angie Gruendemann did not know what to expect going into the WIAA Division 1 Oshkosh West Sectional girls' cross country race Saturday morning at Westhaven Golf Course.

And, after a spectacular sprint to a state-qualifying fourth-place finish, the freshman from Oshkosh West will have the same feeling as an entry in the WIAA State Meet next Saturday at The Ridges Golf Club in Wisconsin Rapids.

With the top six runners and top two teams advancing, Gruendemann, the only state qualifier from Oshkosh, won a three-girl battle for the last two spots in what amounted to a 50-yard sprint down the 10th

won the girls' race in 12:23, and Fond du Lac's Anne Koenigs also qualified for state with a fourth-place 12:44.

But the dash for the final two spots had the crowd cheering the loudest.

Gruendemann ended up with an official time of 12:51, Schaper with a 12:52 and Anderson with a 12:52-plus, but time seemed to stand still as the three approached the finish line.

"I didn't know how many people were in front of me, so I was like, 'Oh, what place am I?'" Gruendemann said. "So I just tried to go as fast as I could as far as I could go.

"Being a freshman, I had no idea what it would be like. It feels different."

Schaper had similar thoughts

as she approached the finish line.

"I didn't know that I needed to beat her," said Schaper, a sophomore. "I started sprinting at about the half-mile mark, and I didn't have anything left.

"I just wanted to run so my team could go to state. I just kept thinking I have to go for my team."

Schaper's teammates responded as well, as the seniorless Rockets placed their top five runners among the top 20.

"I thought we had a good chance at it, but there were four very good teams," said Neenah girls' coach Ron Fedenko. "All seven girls ran exceptionally well."

McCullough, who was 12th but advanced with the entire Fond du Lac team last year as a

Schaper will not be alone, however, as the Neenah girls' team won the sectional title with 68 team points, followed closely by Fox Valley Association rival Fond du Lac with 82. The Oshkosh West girls' were seventh with 159 and Oshkosh North was 11th with 276.

Fond du Lac's Adam McCullough was the boys' sectional champion with a time of 16 minutes, 35 seconds.

However, both the Neenah and Fond du Lac boys' teams fell short, finishing third and fourth, respectively. West Bend West won the boys' race with 66 points, while Manitowoc qualified in second place with 91. Oshkosh North was 13th, Oshkosh West 14th and Menasha 16th.

Two Rivers' Amy Erickson

freshman, will be going alone this year as the Cardinals finished a disappointing fourth.

"I felt great; I think that's the best I've felt all year," said McCullough, adding that he expected to win the race. "That's what I was going for."

The boys' race was a disappointment for other area teams as well. Neenah, the FVA champion, fell just three points short of second-place Manitowoc. The Rockets' Tyler Schultz was seventh, and Rhett Weyenberg eighth.

Joe Werner was Oshkosh West's top boys' finisher at 61st in 18:09. Oshkosh North was led by Jamie Juedes in 46th in 17:52. The Spartans' Ben Tremble was 47th in 14:52.

Thip Luangpraseuth was North's top girls' finisher in 37th place in 13:27.

So what does he expect for an encore in the Division 1 state meet?

"Our goal is to finish in the top eight and preferably the top four," said Fedenko, who doesn't have a senior runner on the varsity.

"When this season started, I didn't know what to expect. But I've seen them working hard every week, their confidence is improving and they're getting better and better."

Fedenko's team is comprised of sophomores Karen Schaper, Julie Olson, Christy Lodner, Julee Beckstrom, freshmen Missy Klabunde and Meghan Patterson and junior Krista Lawell.

Krista Erickson, another freshman who had been the team's third runner, can't compete due to a stress fracture. She will be an alternate.

"I'm just going to tell the kids that this may be a once-in-a-lifetime experience because you never know what can happen," Fedenko said. "I want them to go out and have fun."

► Coach Ron Fedenko's Neenah harriers will make their first state meet appearance since 1987, when they finished eighth.

The Rockets won state championships in 1981, 1982 and 1983 and finished second in 1980 and 1985.

They scored 68 points to outdistance Fond du Lac by 14 in winning the sectional.

Karen Schaper was sixth, Julie Olson 10th, Cristy Cotner 15th, Missy Klabunde 17th, Meghan Patterson 20th, Krista Lawell 43rd and Julee Beckstrom 52nd.

Lawell is a junior. The rest are freshmen and sophomores.

The Division 1 girls' state run will begin at 11 a.m. Saturday at Ridges Golf Club at Wisconsin Rapids.
