Neenah runs away

Rocket boys, girls win Spartan Invitational

Tyler Schultz, Rhett Weyenberg and Bret Weyenberg finished second, third and fifth, respectively, to help lead the Neenah boys' cross country team to a 34-point win at Oshkosh North's Spartan Invitational Thursday.

North finished sixth with 163 points, Menasha seventh with 173 and Berlin eighth with 178.

The Neenah girls' team had four runners in the top 10 to easily win the invitational.

Mario Berden of Marshfield won the boys' race with a time of 16 minutes, 35 seconds. Schultz was second in 16:38, while Rhett Weyenberg ran in 16:41 and Bret Weyenberg in 16:56.

"The runner from Marshfield is really talented," Neenah coach Tom Jensen said. "Tyler, Rhett and Bret stayed right on top of him, and I think that's good."

"Overall, I think our boys ran very well. We have a very competitive situation for our first seven spots. We were ranked No. 4 in this week's poll,

and that puts a lot of pressure on them. I thought they handled it well."

All of Neenah's top five runners finished in the top 15 in the meet. Ryan Freund finished 11th with 17:26, and Tuffy Knoch finished 13th with 17:35.

Jamie Juedes led North runners, finishing seventh in 17:15.

"Jamie did a nice job," Spartan coach Chuck Reigel said. "When you've got so many teams, it's really good to be in the top 10."

"Otherwise, I think we were a little flat."

Eric Sawicki finished 31st in 18:33, and Ben Tremble finished 35th in 18:40.

Jason Lutropp finished ninth in 17:21 to lead Berlin finishers.

"I was real happy to be where we were in the pack at a big meet like this," Berlin coach Dave Reich said. "Our numbers three, four and five runners are running real well as a group. At this point that's really nice to see."

Matt Toeppler had an 18:06 time for 22nd place to lead Menasha runners. Ben Campbell followed for 24th place in 18:17.

In the girls' race, Neenah

finished with 36 points. North finished sixth with 154 points, Menasha eighth with 201 and Berlin ninth with 256.

Missy Olson finished third in 12:40 for the Rockets. Julie Olson followed at 12:47 for fifth place. Meghan Patterson finished seventh in 12:57, and Karen Schaper finished ninth in 13:00.

"We had some really good races today," Neenah coach Ron Fedenko said. "We've run all season as a nice group. This is the type of team where we switch positions a lot from week to week. I think it gives them more competitiveness and something to work for."

"We really just want to keep the pack as tight as we can and

as close to the front as we can."

Menasha's Kim Hotkens was sixth in 12:47.

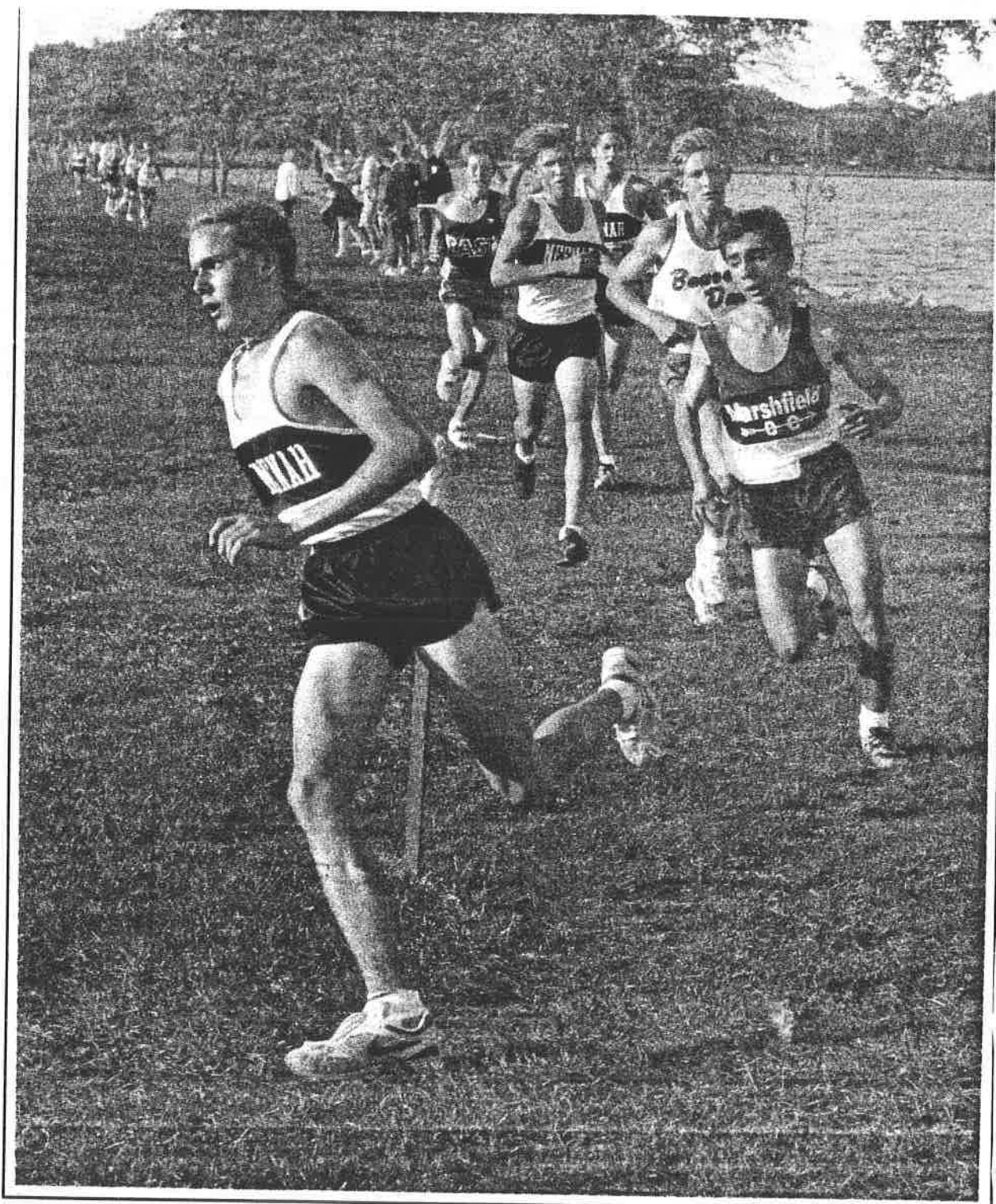
Berlin's Julie Harn also broke into the top 10, finishing eighth in 13:00.

"Julie has been continuing to run strong against some tough competition," Reich said.

Manikhone Luangpraseth (13:22) and Marilyn Bowden (13:29) finished 18th and 21st to lead North runners.

"I saw some excellent competition out there today," Reigel said. "Our girls were fairly closely bunched together. That was nice to see."

"Some of the smaller schools had some outstanding athletes. I enjoyed seeing that, and I think the kids did, too."
