Neenah reloads in pursuit of state championship

NEENAH — The Neenah Rocket prep girls' cross country team finished second in the state tournament meet last year, and this year they return all but two runners from that

team.

Missing are Krista Lawell, graduation and Karen Schaper, who is out for the season because of foot surgery.

So with eight letterwinners returning and the biggest group of runners out for the team in coach Ron Fedenko's 11 years, the season looks bright for the Rockets.

"I have 21 runners, which is the biggest group I've ever had," said Fedenko. "We are looking for a good, successful season, and if everything holds true, we will have one."

The letterwinners returning for the Rockets are seniors Julie Beckstrom, Christy Codner and Julie Olson, jun-

iors Krista Erickson, Missy Klabunde and Meghan Patterson, and sophomores Sara Codner and Christy McCutcheon.

Other runners back from last year's team are senior Mysee Moua, junior Lisa Heroux, and sophomores Holly Goudreau and Mandy Gunderson.

Newcomers to the team this year are sophomores Megan Mutchler and Liz Stelow, and freshmen Sarah Brey, Shayna Brown, Alicia Hilliker, Danelle Johnson, Heather Mickalkiewicz, Norel Miller and Sara Mulroy.

Even with all the experienced runners returning, Fedenko doesn't know who is

going to run where yet.

"Right now, we don't know who is going to run for us," he said. "In girls' cross country, it gets harder for the runners as they mature. It's hard to tell right now. We haven't done much to see who is going to be where."

Fedenko is also looking to see if some of the freshmen runners will make a strong statement.

"Some of our younger runners have to step forward, like Christy McCutcheon did last year," Fedenko said. "She became our number one runner as a freshman last year. With girls' cross country, there is always that unknown freshman. A freshman can come

along with a lot of talent, and there you are."

Fedenko was also pleased with the amount of work his team did over the summer.

"They did a pretty good job of running in the summer, which has been a problem for us in past years," he added. "They have all done some work over the summer. I'm pleased with what the team did as a group."

Now the Rockets will have to see if their off-season work habits will pay off.

Neenah boys chase 4th straight title

NEENAH — This year's Neenah boys' cross country team will be trying to win a fourth consecutive Fox Valley Association championship.

That's something that hasn't been done in the 26 years that Tom Jensen has been coaching at Neenah.

"We have a veteran team with a lot of depth," Jensen said. "We should be able to challenge for a fourth straight title. It's going to be a challenge though. Appleton East has a very strong team and there are a lot of other strong teams in the conference."

Blazing the trail for the veteran Rockets, who place third in the state meet last year, are senior lettermen Rhett and Bret Weyenberg, Jay Frater and Justin Bricco, and junior letterwinners Ben Miller and

Ryan Freund.

"Our leading runners our the returning lettermen," said Jensen. "I would suspect that they will be our top six kids. As the season progresses, someone may push one of them, but it's going to be tough to do."

Among those who may do the pushing are senior Ryan Mulroy, juniors Brian Wankel, Jamie Michalkiewicz, Chad Goreckte and Rich Rasmussen and sophomores Andy Marks and Chris Core.

Other prospects are juniors Jamie Remme and Ryan Hayes, and sophomores Mike Heidke, Jason Wendler, Joe Nichols and Blaine Schultz.

Jensen will be counting on his seniors for a lot more than just good times. They will be the ones providing the leadership.

"The seniors will definitely provide the leadership," he

said. "There's no pressure on the juniors and sophomores except to contribute. The seniors have been around the block and know what it's all about. They don't have to be motivated by me. It's nice to have a senior class like that."

Although the top six runners appear to be set, Jensen expects the competition to be fierce for the remaining positions.

"The interesting thing about cross country is that the coach doesn't set the lineup, the kids do," he said. "It's going to be a battle every week for those spots. The kids will have to work hard to stay ahead. For some kids, the greatest competition may come from within our own team trying for varsity spots."

"It's a healthy situation to be in. This is our largest number of kids in years and they are a wonderful group to work with."
