## ■ The Neenah girls are making their fifth-straight trek to the WIAA meet

The Neenah girls cross country team was dethroned as champion but its second-place finish in the WIAA Division 1 sectional at Oshkosh earned it a berth in Saturday's state meet at Wisconsin Dells.

The Rockets, making their fifth-straight state meet journey, collected 67 points in last Saturday's meet to trail champion Fond du Lac by 22 points.

Menasha placed 14th in the 15-team field with 396 points.

The Neenah boys were third, one place short of qualifying, with 65 points, but Mike Heidke earned a state-meet berth with his sixth-place finish.

Fond du Lac, with 41 points, and West Bend West, with 56, paced the teams.

Menasha didn't have enough finishers to be considered in the team scoring.

Sara Codner led the Neenah girls with her eighth-place finish in 16:05.

Teammate Tina Schraufnagel

was ninth in 16:06.

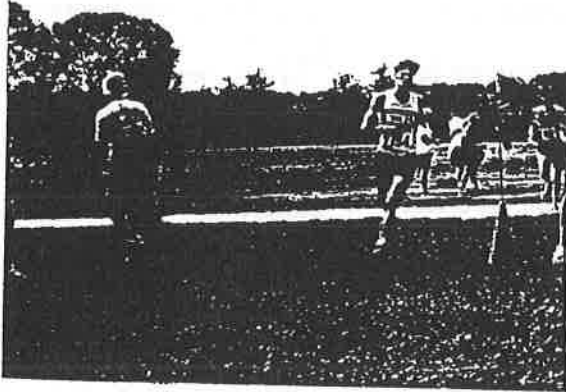

# PREP CROSS COUNTRY

■ **The FVA champion slips to fourth at sectional, but he will try again at state**

OSHKOSH — Appleton East's Dugan Webster is entering uncharted territory — sort of.

The two-time defending Fox Valley Association boys' cross country champion earned a return trip to the state tournament with a fourth-place finish at Saturday's Division 1 Oshkosh West Sectional at Far Vu Golf Course.

In his last state appearance as a sophomore two years ago, Webster did not finish the race because of a pulled hamstring.

"I haven't had good luck down there, so I'm hoping to change things come next week," said the Patriots' senior.

The top six individual winners and top two teams qualified for state, which will take place next Saturday at Wisconsin Rapids.

As FVA champion, Webster was favored at sectionals, but he finished behind winner Aaron Vandeslunt of Fond du Lac, Oshkosh West's Phil Keskinen and Fond du Lac's Brad Theyerl.

"I'm not disappointed, but I feel I could have won," said Webster. "In Division 1 you have to run a good race to win, and that's what Aaron Vandeslunt did. Everybody has their day, and today it was those three guys' day, and last week was mine."

Also qualifying in the boys' race was Neenah's Mike Heidtke, who came in sixth behind West Bend West's Nick Minderman.

"I was just hoping the team could go," said Heidtke. "I was just run-

ning for that, for the team to go to state."

However, Heidtke's Rockets were denied a state berth by just nine points, finishing third behind West Bend West. Fond du Lac won the team title with 41 points.

The Cardinals made it a sweep by taking the girls' team title, led by individual winner Kendra Fredrick, who won her third consecutive sectional title. Oshkosh West's Bridget Kessen took second.

Neenah put together a second-place score of 67 points to earn its fourth consecutive trip to state. Sara Codner led the squad with an eighth-place finish.

"We don't have a real Kendra Fredrick or (Bridget) Kessen," said Neenah coach Ron Fedenko. "We try to go with whoever is our lead runner, and everybody else stay with her."

The Rockets edged out Appleton East by 10 points, but the Patriots had a state qualifier in Emily Gebheim, who came in sixth.

"I didn't expect it," said Gebheim. "I knew I could do it, but I wasn't counting on it. The coach just try stick in there with the cause I did it at conference, too."
