The harriers will travel to De Pere Friday afternoon for the sectional with the top two teams and first six individuals moving on to the Nov. 2 state run at Wisconsin Rapids.

The course is on the De Pere High School grounds and will feature the boys race at 4 p.m. and the girls run at 4:30.

Joining Neenah and Menasha in the field will be Appleton East, Appleton North, Appleton West, Ashwaubenon, De Pere, Fond du Lac, Kaukauna, Manitowoc, Oshkosh North, Oshkosh West, Plymouth, Sheboygan North and Sheboygan South.

The leading girls runners were Menasha's Katie Olander, sixth, and Neenah's Kimberly Steffens, 15th; Kristi Morris, 17th; and Tina Schraufnagel, 18th.

The top boys finishers were Neenah's Paul Mason, sixth; Ryan Waterstreet, eighth; Jason Olson, ninth; Nick Madsen, 11th; and Shawn Albee, 13th.

Neenah's junior varsity boys and girls teams also won championships.

The Neenah soccer team makes its bid for a return trip to the state meet when it opens regional play at 2:45 p.m. Thursday at Fond du Lac against the Cardinals.

The winner will meet Menasha at Neenah's Rocket Stadium at 5 p.m. Saturday in the regional finals.

Saturday's winner will advance to the sectional semifinals at Oshkosh North on Oct. 31.

The sectional finals are scheduled at Oshkosh West on Nov. 2.

Other teams in the sectional field are Kaukauna, Oshkosh

North, Oshkosh West, Plymouth, Sheboygan South, Sheboygan North, Port Washington, West Bend East and West Bend West.

With Appleton East's first loss, the Rockets, by virtue of their 9-3 decision over Appleton North, moved into a share of the conference lead.

Menasha beat Appleton West 3-2 and lost to Oshkosh West 3-2 in last week's FVA matches.

St. Mary Central downed Oshkosh Lourdes 5-2 but lost to Green Bay Northwestern Wisconsin Lutheran 2-1 in Mid-State Soccer League matches last week.

Neenah, in recent swimming meets, finished third in the Oshkosh West Sprint Invitational and lost to Fond du Lac 104-82 in a dual, while Menasha was outscored by Appleton East 118-68.
