SHAWANO - The Neenah boys and girls cross country teams contin-ued to dominate the Shawano Invitational by sweeping to first place in both divisions Saturday morning. The Shawano championship was the sixth in a row for both squads.

The boys have won 13 titles since 1962 and the girls have won 12 since 1980.

The boys captured their meet with 68 points, three less than runner-up Green Bay East and 10 fewer than perennial power Green Bay Preble.

Menasha finished eighth in the nine-team field with 256 points, one less than Green Bay West.
