WAUWATOSA - Eileen Schaller and her Neenah High School girls' cross country running mates made it four straight invitationals Saturday by sweeping first place in the Wauwatosa East meet.

Schaller, unbeaten in four invitationals, led the Rockets to a low

score of 22 points.

Oak Creek trailed the defending meet champions with 45 points, the closest an opponent has come this fall, and Racine Case was third with
