# Division 1 cross country teams Competition is stiff for area

The WIAA Division 1 West Bend cross country sectional on Saturday offers a contrast in the boys' and girls' run.

The boys' portion of the meet is loaded, with four of the top six teams in the state vying for the two team spots that go with it.

Meanwhile, the girls' race will feature just one ranked team — that being Neenah — and while the Rockets are heavily favored to make a return trip to state, the secondolace spot and the state berth hat goes with it is up for grabs.

The girls' run is slated to begin at 11 a.m. with the boys' run to follow at 11:30 a.m. The meet will be held at the WestBendHigh Schools' cambus.

"In the boys' race, anything can happen," Appleton East coach Joe Perez said. "We've run against them all and we'll settle for either of the top two spots."

The Patriots boys are ranked second in the state, while West Bend West is the top-rated team. Beaver Dam and Neenah are fifth and sixth, respectively.

"We split with West Bend West and beat both Beaver DamandNeenah," Perezsaid. "There are also a few other

teams that are decent and could hurtyou. Manitowocand Sheboygan North have a few good quality people. It's about the hardest sectional I ever remember being in."

Aaron Sass, Abe Mendoza and Dugan Webster have consistently finished near the top for East, which also has received steady performances from Scott Myers and Dave Johnson, who are usually the Patriots' fourth and fifth run-

The Neenah boys will be led by cousins Rhett and Bret Weyenberg, who placed first and fifth, respectively in the Fox Valley Association meet.

Other area boys who may fare well are Appleton West's Ryan Patschke and Menasha's Matt Toeppler along with Neenah's Chad Gorectke.

One advantage Perez gives to West Bend West is that the sectional will be run on its

home course.

"They are very familiar with it," Perez said. "It's a fair course, but our kids have never

Neenah girls' coach Ron Fedenko also believes the West Bend teams will have an advantage and West Bend West is a team mentioned that could be the Rockets' closest competitors.

"West Bend will be running in its own backyard which is a definite advantage," Fedenko said. "I know it'd be a pretty difficult thing to do, but it would be nice to get a course which is totally alien to all the schools at the sectional."

Neenah, which finished second at last year's state meet, should return to state if it runs up to its capabilities.

"Our basic outlook is to do the best we can," Fedenko said. "We still have to run the race to make it back to state. Everyone is healthy, the girls are working hard and they've

been running well.

"The girls have talked about going back to state. Two years ago, getting to state was their goal and we finished 15th, The girls were basically happy just to be there. Last year when we went back to state, the girls had some idea what to expect and they ran very well."

The consistent Neenah team has been led by Christy McCutcheon, Meghan Patterson and Julie Olson, who finished third, fourth and fifth, respectively at the FVA meet. Christy Codner and Sara Codner have been the usual fourth and fifth runners for the Rockets.

"Neenah should pretty much win the girls' race," Perez said. "After that, it probably will be between four, five or six teams. The Appleton West girls have a chance if they run a top race."

# The qualifiers will advance to the state meet at Wisconsin Rapids

The Neenah boys and girls cross country teams will defend their WIAA sectional championships Saturday at West Bend.

The sectional will be held on the high school campus with the girls meet slated at 11 a.m. followed by the boys race at 11:30 a.m.

First- and second-place teams and the first six individual finishers will qualify for the Oct. 30 state meet at Wisconsin Rapids.

The sectional field is composed of Appleton East, Appleton West, Beaver Dam, Fond du Lac, Kaukauna, Manitowoc, Menasha, Neenah, Oshkosh North, Oshkosh West, Plymouth, Sheboygan North, Sheboygan South, West Bend East and West Bend West.

The Neenah boys garnered the 1992 sectional crown at Sheboygan

with 63 points.

Tyler Schultz, the Rockets' top finisher at fifth place, has graduated.

Fond du Lac's Adam McCullough, the individual winner, was killed in an automobile accident in August.

The Neenah girls will go after their third straight sectional crown. They won the 1992 title with 46 points.

Christy McCutcheon and Meghan Patterson led the champions with fourth- and fifth-place finishes, respectively.

Two Rivers' Amy Erickson has won two straight individual championships.

The Menasha boys were 13th and the girls 14th a year ago. Kim Hofkens finished 13th in the girls event.

The Patriots totaled 32 points, 20

# Neenah, **Patriots** take a big step

■ The Appleton East boys and Rocket girls capture sectional titles en route to the **WIAA state cross** country meet

WEST BEND - The road to the WIAA state cross country meet was smooth for two Fox Valley Association teams on Saturday.

The Neenah girls and Appleton East boys each qualified their entire teams for Saturday's WIAA state meet at the Ridges Golf Course in Wisconsin Rapids by winning their respective sectional races.

Neenah dominated the girls' race, finishing with five runners in the top 10. But that was no surprise for Neenah coach Ron Fedenko.

"We'd run against most of these teams before so we figured we have a pretty good showing," said Fedenko.

Kendra Frederickson of Fond du Lac set a fast pace and won the 4,000-meter race in 15 minutes, 26 seconds.

"It just felt right to go out fast, take the lead and keep it," said Fre-

Christy McCutcheon led the Neenah runners with a second-place showing.

"I tried to get up there but I couldn't keep with her," said Mc-Cutcheon of Frederickson. "She just ran a good race."

Running in close quarters to Mc-Cutcheon were teammates Meghan Patterson, fourth; Julie Olson, sixth; Sara Codner, eighth; and Christy Codner, 10th.

The top six individuals and top two teams earned trips to the state

Also going to Wisconsin Rapids will be Appleton West's Sarah McGlone, who finished fourth.

"This race seemed kind of easy for me," said McGlone. "There wasn't a lot of pain or anything because it was mostly downhill."

The boys' race was like a state meet, with top-ranked West Bend West, third-ranked Appleton East, fifth-ranked Beaver Dam and sixthranked Neenah among the compet-

Neenah's Rhett Weyenberg led for about the first 2,000 meters before Scott Hammer of West Bend West passed him and took a lead he would not surrender, winning the 5.000-meter race in 16:26.

"I knew he was gonna give me a really good race and he did," said Weyenberg. "I lost him at about the mile-and-a-half mark, closed in on

him again but I never really thought I could catch him."

Rhett's second-place finish was qualifed him for state as did Brett Weyenberg's sixth-place finish.

"It's a good feeling but really I wish the whole team was going, said Brett. "That's what it is all

Neenah boys' coach Tom Jensen was happy that at least both Weyenbergs qualified.

"They're cousins and they've been running together since they were small. It's a thrill to see them

Appleton East put its depth to good use with five runners finishing in the top 20.

'We've got pretty good strength up front and good number four and five runners," said Patriots coach Joe Perez.

Dugan Webster; running despite a sore hamstring, led the Patriots with a fourth-place finish.

"I pulled it last week at the conference meet," said Webster. "But it only bothered me going up hills to-

The Patriots' Aaron Sass found out how tough the competition was

"The guys took it out really fast, a lot faster than we had intended on,' said Sass. "We were able to gradually move up, though.'

Despite his team's first-place finish, Perez tried downplaying the 23point win over top-ranked West Bend West.

"They beat us by 20 two weeks ago so it can change anytime," said Perez.
