As in the FVA meet, McDonald and Kaukauna's Christy Cazzola ran evenly through the first mile, but McDonald then moved steadily ahead and finished 34 seconds ahead of the Ghosts junior.

"I was hoping she'd go under 14 (minutes)," Neenah coach

Tara Meinke said of McDonald. "Betsy knows that if she feels comfortable, she isn't running fast enough.

Jill Winkler was 10th and Emily Burns 11th for the Rockets, who captured the team title with 69 points, while the Ghosts, with three runners in the top seven, finished with 76.

No other area individual girls qualified for the state meet.
